We know that God has a lot in store for our



Fostering is all around us and the need for more foster homes is acute. Right now, in Greene Co., there are almost 800 children in foster care, and in SW MO there are over 1000 kids in foster care.

SW MO has the most children in foster care of any region in the state.

We have the highest rate of child abuse and neglect in the state AND one of the highest rates in the entire country!

Generations Village will be opening next year to provide a community of hope and healing for foster kids that will also provide a meaningful and fulfilling place to live for senior adults.

There will be homes for 12 foster families with up to 6 kids in each, 36 homes for seniors who are willing and interested in being a part of the healing and redemptive process for traumatized kids, and 8 units for youth who have aged out of foster care but still want and need the emotional, mental, and spiritual support they received in Generations Village as foster kids to continue their journey towards a successful future

Generations Village will be a lively, active, and restorative community where all Villagers will be part of a loving, caring, and supportive neighborhood and where everyone--no matter the age, race, gender, or economic level--is valued and appreciated as a unique child of God.

Our church calendar is even more busy! Our Aldersgate family continues to grow as we continue in our commitment to reach out with the love of Christ and teach the Word to make disciples with an active faith in Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. With over 500 people worshipping here together across multiple services each Sunday, our church family has reached a size where it is difficult to know everyone, and that makes it easy to get detached from the heartbeat of the church. But we are always so short of teachers and helpers for children's Sunday school and Wednesday Night Kids that it becomes a crisis whenever a teacher has to call in sick.

I know we have many adults who love teens and know how important it is to connect them to God the Rock in the storms of adolescence who would make great youth sponsors! (Even helping provide snacks on a regular basis would be a huge help!)

I know we have many adults who recognize the need for church security and who have a protector's heart of service required for such a role. But we still don't have enough members of SHIELD to provide security for all activities where kids and youth are present, let alone all our other activities.

I know we have plenty of good writers and photographers who would make great Gatepost reporters, plenty of smiling faces who would make great greeters and ushers, plenty of singers and musicians who would make great additions to our choir and praise teams and plenty of growing disciples who would make great small group leaders or class facilitators. We have no lack of spiritual gifts among us and no one who lacks a spiritual gift because the apostle Paul affirms in 1 Corinthians 12:7, "Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good."






Ever wondered how all the ministries of Aldersgate happen?

The original amount of the loan for the new Learning Center was \$4,162,200. The current balance as of September 30, 2024, is \$3,085,576.

The end of the year is quickly approaching. The members of Aldersgate have supported many local causes this year, including Least of These and Abundant Blessings, and we are looking into ways to support world missions during the Christmas season. Each year, we take a special offering at each of the Christmas Eve services, and we are considering partnering with Convoy of Hope to use this additional offering to spread Christ's light to a place in the world where that love is needed.

If you're doing some year-end tax planning, keep in mind Aldersgate can accept donations of stock. The church can also accept QCDs (IRS slang for qualified charitable distributions), which are tax-free distributions from an IRA (more cool slang – individual retirement account, or "individual retirement arrangement," if you're really hip to IRS vernacular). Either stock donations or QCDs can be effective ways to reduce tax liability while maximizing giving to the church.
