The word "evangelism" can be scary. It brings to mind knocking on strangers' doors and asking them if they know Jesus, but the heart of evangelism is Jesus' command to love others as he has loved us. What could be more loving than sharing Jesus' love with those we know who don't yet know him?


In the six to eight weeks, we will spend together, we will explore the essential aspects of the Gospel and develop some strategies for practicing our faith more effectively in the relationships God has given us. We will discuss our many understandings of the basic tenets of faith, what C. S. Lewis terms, "Mere Christianity." This will include sharing bible study tools and common preconceptions about the Gospel.

Along with mapping out the "What" of our faith, we will also discuss the "How" of sharing your faith in Jesus with kindness and respect. All of us have witnessed attitudes and techniques that are more and less successful. Greg Koukl will introduce an inductive approach to sharing our faith with others.

We will also look at scripture to help understand the heart of evangelism. The Gospel of Mark has been described as the story of Jesus who cares. We will look at several New Testament passages that illustrate Christian caring.

In the book of Exodus, we are told about Moses going into the Tent of Meeting to talk with God "as a friend speaks with a friend." He emerged with a kind of glow about him that we too as bearers of Good News can have. The class will be Wed. nights at 6:30 PM.



The original amount of the loan for the new Learning Center was \$4,162,200. The current balance as of November 30, 2024, is \$3,055,957.

At the time of this writing, we still face a significant budget deficit as the calendar ticks down to the end of our fiscal year, but we have faith. God gives us everything we need, as He is a good Father, and we get to continue seeking and serving Him. Whatever the year-end financial statement shows, we are blessed as His children and as a church family, and we have much to be hopeful for.

Aldersgate has been served well this past year by a competent and committed Finance Committee. This committee consists of a few people who are "automatically" included in the Finance Committee by virtue of serving in other leadership roles, plus a few at-large members. Our at-large members this year were Lee Clark and Dick Williams; both used the wisdom gained from their extensive professional experience to ask good questions and offer valuable ideas and guidance, and both are willing to do extra when needed. Robert Turner continued the string of Property Oversight (formerly "Trustees") chairpersons to be very engaged in their Finance Committee roles, in addition to having non-stop duties and concerns in the care of our campus. Especially deserving of thanks at this time is Jeff McCurry, who will leave the Finance Committee because he has completed a multi-year term as chairperson of the Staff-Parish Relations Committee. The SPR Chair position is demanding, challenging, and critical; we have been blessed to have amazing, dedicated people in this role. Throughout his term on the Finance Committee, in addition to his SPR responsibilities, Jeff was willing to take the minutes of our meetings, for which we are very grateful. Pastor Dennis' combination of business perspective and spiritual leadership keeps us focused. Marvin Miller, former committee chair, came on board mid-year as church bookkeeper; we are fortunate to have someone of his knowledge and experience in this important role.

Finally, there's not enough room here to adequately thank Brenda Clark for the work she does to prepare herself and our committee for monthly meetings, follow up on things after meetings, and keep the business of our church moving every day. To each of these committee participants and all the others who keep the business of the church running well, thank you for your service!

What You Gain From Church Attendance

I was reading an article recently and this section stuck out to me. As we begin this new year please prioritize attending church.

If you are currently experiencing church apathy, you may have lost perspective on how much church attendance truly helps your Christian life. It is good to reflect on these truths every once in a while, especially if we are struggling.

Spiritual Education – One of the most important aspects of your church attendance is the fact that when you attend church services, go to Bible classes and listen to sermons you are receiving a spiritual education. Your ministers and teachers at church are there to help educate you on the things of the Bible and how to apply those principles to your life. When you miss out on these services or classes you are missing out on an opportunity to learn more about your Lord and Savior.

Time to Worship – Another important part of your church attendance is having an opportunity to worship the Lord. Matthew 18:20 says, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." When Christians are gathered together in the right attitude and spirit, the presence of the Lord is there. This is a prime chance to worship the Lord. Worshiping together with other Christians is very different from worshipping alone. However, I cannot exactly explain in words how this is different, if you have ever experienced it then you know.

When we worship our souls are renewed. Our connection to God is strengthened. When we worship as a group our connection to one another is strengthened as well.

Godly Fellowship – In addition to these two important things, there is also the aspect of Godly fellowship. Christians need to fellowship with other Christians. When we miss out on this important part of our Christian life it can begin to affect our attitude and our spirit. Isolation can even begin to lead to depression in some people. It can be an ugly cycle. You don't feel like being around people, but being alone makes you sad. Do you see how that can turn into an unhealthy cycle?

First Things First

If you have found yourself feeling apathetic about church, then the first thing you should attempt is to get your regular church attendance on a good schedule. It helps if you simply don't give yourself an option. Don't think in terms of, "Do I want to go to church today?" But rather think in terms of, "I'm going to church today." Don't give yourself options. You know you should go, so just go.

What Next?

After you have gotten yourself to church regularly, now is the time to start getting involved. Your perspective on church will truly change once you start getting involved. There are always ways you can get involved. All you need to do is listen and pay attention.

Pretty soon you will discover that people are asking for volunteers for stuff all the time, but you have been tuning this out because you did not want to be involved. Selective hearing is a truly amazing thing.

You no longer have selective hearing, though. Now you are listening because you want to get involved.

Make this year matter and grow in your spiritual walk.
